The Ginger Creek Community is served by two award-winning school districts. In addition to public schools, Ginger Creek is located within a short distance of some of finest public and private schools in Illinois.



Listed below are the available public and private schools which serve the Ginger Creek Community.

Ginger Creek is served by two public school districts: [Butler School District 53](#) (Named for Paul Butler, the founder of Ginger Creek) and [Downers Grove School District 58](#).

These two school districts have low student teacher ratios, high educational standards, and safe, nurturing environments.

The two public high schools that serve Ginger Creek, [Hinsdale Central](#) and [Downers Grove North](#), are both nationally recognized as high-quality public high schools.



In addition, there are many fantastic private schools in proximity to Ginger Creek. Many of these are faith-based institutions, which include Catholic schools. The Notre Dame Parish school in Clarendon Hills and the Saint Isaac Jogues School and St. Mary of Gostyn provides sound, faith-centered grammar school experiences. Montini Catholic High School, Fenwick High School, and Timothy Christian prepare youths for college. For Islamic students, College Prep School of America is easily accessible and offers an excellent education.

 - Founded 1956 by the Joliet Diocese
 - Originally, the faculty was nuns from the order of Sisters of Christian Charity
 - PK-8, 1
 - 3/1 Student/Faculty ratio,
 - Approximately 200 students
- [St. Mary of Gostyn School](#)
 - Comprehensive curriculum that follows Diocese of Joliet Standards
 - Curriculum emphasizes creativity, critical and analytical thinking, and real-world application with a Catholic worldview.
 - Core classes in reading/literacy, mathematics, science, social studies
 - Spanish language instruction beginning in Kindergarten
 - Music, art and physical education
 - 1:1 Technology Initiative - each student has his/her own electronic device for learning
 - K-3: iPads
 - Grade 4: Microsoft Surface Tablets
 - Grade 5-8: Samsung Chromebooks
 - Google Classroom - replicates technology used by local high schools
 - SchoolSpeak parent communication program
 - Found in each classroom: interactive whiteboards, document cameras, ceiling mounted projectors

 - Approximately 430 Students
